The data request you made of the Department of Alcohol and Drug Programs, Office of Applied Research and Analysis regarding the underlying county-level data for Figure 3.4 in the 2004 University of California, Los Angeles (UCLA) Substance Abuse and Crime Prevention Act of 2000 (SACPA) report is enclosed.

The two state fiscal years (SFYs) shown, SFY 2001-02 and SFY 2002-03, indicate the year a SACPA offender entered treatment. Individual SACPA clients were tracked in the California Alcohol and Drug Data System (CADDs) for up to 18 months after admission to capture his/her "Completed treatment/recovery plan and/or goals" discharge. Only discharges under this CADDs discharge status were counted. As we do not have access to UCLA's data files and our CADDs is regularly updated, we are not able to precisely replicate the data used by UCLA to generate the figure. However, the relative county relationships presented here accurately reflect the results provided by UCLA.
